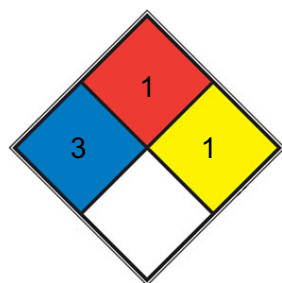
### Advice for firefighters
