If vomiting occurs, lean patient forward or place on the left side (head-down position, if possible) to maintain an open airway and prevent aspiration. 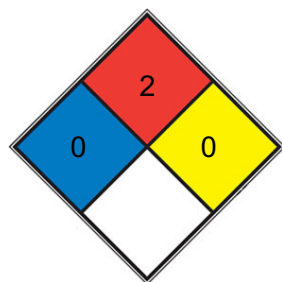

Provision to contain effluent from fire extinguishing. Store in an area without drain or sewer access. Ventilation along the floor. Keep container tightly closed in a dry and well-ventilated place. Recommended storage temperature 2-8 deg C.

Toxicity to daphnia and other aquatic invertebrates: EC50; Species: *Daphnia magna* (water flea) < or = 24 hr old; Conditions: static, 20 + or - 1 deg C, water hardness 240 mg/L (CaCO<sub>3</sub>), pH 7.7-8.0; Concentration: 15 mg/L for 48 hr; Effect: immobility /Purity 97.1%

### Persistence and degradability

AEROBIC: Linalyl acetate, present at 100 mg/L, reached 75% of its Theoretical BOD in 4 weeks using an activated sludge inoculum at 30 mg/L and the Japanese MITI test(1).

### Bioaccumulative potential

An estimated BCF of 180 was calculated in fish for linalyl acetate(SRC), using a log Kow of 3.93(1) and a regression-derived equation(2).

According to a classification scheme(3), this BCF suggests the potential for bioconcentration in aquatic organisms is high(SRC).

### Mobility in soil

Using a structure estimation method based on molecular connectivity indices(1), the Koc of linalyl acetate can be estimated to be 430(SRC).

According to a classification scheme(2), this estimated Koc value suggests that linalyl acetate is expected to have moderate mobility in soil.

### Disposal methods

#### Product

The material can be disposed of by removal to a licensed chemical destruction plant or by controlled incineration with flue gas scrubbing. Do not contaminate water, foodstuffs, feed or seed by storage or disposal. Do not discharge to sewer systems.

#### Contaminated packaging

Containers can be triply rinsed (or equivalent) and offered for recycling or reconditioning. Alternatively, the packaging can be punctured to make it unusable for other purposes and then be disposed of in a sanitary landfill. Controlled incineration with flue gas scrubbing is possible for combustible packaging materials.
